Finance: The NZ dollar has firmed and is at a 3 month high. The higher dollar will have an effect on meat schedules and the wool sales.

Wool: prices were down 1% to 3% and the pass-in rate was around 9%.

Sheep & Venison meats: New year schedules are showing some signs of easing as the dollar rises and supply increases.

Beef Schedules: are steady and the recent rains have seen some improved grass growth rates allowing farmers to retain animals.

Dairy Prices: There is still some uncertainty in the dairy prices and the WMP prices are set around the NZ supply. The expected lower seasonal production has been positive but it is a finely balanced international market.

There are number of farms on the market and it appears as though the market is soft with buyers dictating prices. There is some concern and some confusion in the Waikato surrounding the WRC Plan Change 1. Ensure you understand the nitrogen reference point and how it may affect any future plans you as a buyer might have.
