Finance: The NZ dollar remains steady around the 66 to 67 cent mark against the US dollar but did drop to a new low mid week at just over 65 cents - a bit tough on the travellers!!!.

Wool: The wool prices last week were up 2% to 3% on the previous week. The pass-in rate was 20%. Some premium quality fine wools are selling at record prices around the \$22/kg mark.

Sheep & Venison meats: All mutton prices are up for the coming week. Lamb is continuing to rise with some companies now offering over \$8/kg. The venison schedules are very good and are still trending upwards.

Beef Schedules: The manufacturing meat schedules are up for the coming week with minor inter-company variations having little impact on the overall schedule rates.

Dairy Prices: Most dairy commodities are steady to weaker and there is some concern again around the easing of the g/DT (Auctions). New season production is not yet hitting the markets as the production season is just getting underway.

The Fonterra result is best described as a disaster and even after the one-off adjustments are made for the Chinese investment and the Danone debacle it is still a poor result. The 10 cent dividend on a \$5.10 share is a poor return while the Farm Gate ,milk price at \$6.70 is OK.
